Invitation

Dear colleagues,

we invite You herewith to submit proposals for the next meeting. The topic on the quality of life and working life in a comparative perspective between Germany & Japan has been selected, as it seems of high relevance for the sustainability of our societies. Germany and Japan have for many reasons similarities as late comers in industrialisation and modernisation, with a strong state, and imperialist past.

At the same time in a dialectical relationship welfare systems developed to counteract on strong labour movements, and at the same high discipline and obedience (Untertan) became characteristics of everyday-life and industrial production. "Made in Germany" won the prestige of high quality. With some delay the same happened to Japan after the Second World War.

The economic miracles brought for both countries never known living standards, but also environmental hazards, intensification of work (e.g. karôshi), long distance commuting, sexual liberalisation, multiculturalism, new cities, travelling etc. The meeting will treat all these aspects from different disciplinary, but especially from interdisciplinary perspectives. Main topics will be therefore and the sessions structured accordingly:

- The political and legal frameworks for quality of life & working life (protection of the individual and minorities, collective and social rights, political parties; citizenship and good governance, democracy)
- 2. The economic dimension and factors (power of business, especially the financial sector, the role of trade unions; working conditions; income distribution etc.)
- 3. The social dimension (class structures, gender issues, travelling, commuting, housing, neighbourhood etc.)
- 4. The cultural dimension (arts, education and science, media, leisure/entertainment)
- 5. The quality of the environment including the built environment (pollution, infrastructure, housing, waste treatment, water quality)

Papers shall focus on the comparative dimension as well. They should be in English, however, German as well as Japanese is possible, if there are summaries in English given. <u>Deadline</u> for the full paper is 1 August 2008. As in the past, it is planned to publish the proceedings with an international publisher.
